News from the project

Bashbari Pre-Primary Education Centre opens Helping children and widows stay warm in winter

The Bashbari centre is the 5th shelter we have constructed, mainly using money left to Friends of Khasdobir in legacies. Having a simple and specially constructed space makes a huge difference to the learning environment for the children. The teachers at the schools have also been eager to paint murals on the walls of the centres to support their teaching -for example numbers and letters of the alphabet.

The Bashbari Centre, and attached washroom, was officially opened on 15th December. It serves an area on the edge of Sylhet city including some families living in slums and some working on the tea garden who originally came from another part of Bangladesh called Comilla.

The main guest at the opening was the Chief Officer of the Bangladesh Government for the Sylhet area, Ms. Kazi Mohua Momtaz. She congratulated the project and said how impressed she was with the centre and the work that it was doing to operate safely during the covid -19 pandemic and provide an introductory education to young children from the area

In Bangladesh it is very warm for most of the year but for a few weeks in December and January it becomes very cold and none of the people we support have heating in their homes, which are often made of simple materials such as bamboo and metal sheets.



This year the project organised the distribution of warm clothes to every pre-primary school student. The clothes were all donated locally by adults who took their examinations in the same year when they were younger. 10 blankets were also distributed to widows and children in most need, based on information provided by the outreach workers. These blankets were also paid for by former students from Sylhet who completed their exams together, but in a different year.

Shakil Ahmed- one of our computer class trainees



Md. Shakil Ahmed is one of our computer class trainees. He lives in a rented house with his father, mother and two sisters. He is currently a student. His father paints buildings and his mother is a housewife. The family income was not sufficient to maintain the cost of education.

The free computer training provided by the project gave Shakil a glimmer of hope. He took part in the computer training successfully from March 2019 to November 2020 including Basic Computer Operating, Internet Browsing, Microsoft Office (MS Word, MS PowerPoint & MS Excel), Photo & Video Editing, Graphics Design (Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator), Website Design and Easy Android App Development. During the training he joined a local marketing agency as a part-time graphic designer and earned a monthly salary. With his salary, he is now able to support the costs of his and his sisters' education as well as other family expenses.

Moriom Begum - one of our sewing trainees

Moriom Begum is 38 years old and took part in the Khasdobir Project's sewing training from September 2018 until June 2020. She lives on the Lakkatora tea estate with her family of two sons and a daughter. The sons are both in school and the daughter is 18 months old. Her husband works, but the family income was not enough to cover the cost of education. She therefore joined the sewing training and successfully completed the course.

After completing her training, she bought an old sewing machine with some money saved and some money given by her husband. She went to every house in her area and told the neighbours that she could sew for them. Now she sews for people in her area and receives 150 taka (about £1.50) for sewing each complete dress. Every day she makes a minimum of 2 dresses, sometimes more. Her minimum income is therefore 300 taka per day, and she spends this on her son's education. As a result of her work, her value in the family has increased a lot and her opinions and decisions are given more importance. She now feels much more empowered in her family.

Celebrating Bangladesh Victory Day

16th December is the anniversary of Bangladesh's victory in the war of liberation and this year the Project organised a programme with different competitions including art, telling the story of the liberation war, and essay writing by the computer students. The programme ended with a discussion about the liberation war with guests including local councillors and officials of local primary schools.
