The Mayor of Camden visits the Khasdobir Project

On 4th October the project was pleased to welcome the Mayor of Camden, British Bangladeshi Nazma Rahman, and her delegates from Bangladesh and Britain to visit the project.

In the morning the mayor visited three schools. At our office-based school she heard rhymes recited by the children and taught the children an English rhyme – "One, two, three, four five once I caught a fish alive".

From the office we went to Malnichara tea estate, the oldest tea garden in the Indian sub-continent. There the children performed songs and a dance. The mayor was interviewed by British Bangladeshi television channel "S".

At our Lakkatura centre the mayor attended a guardian meeting and chatted to the children and the guardians about their lives on the tea estate and their children's education.

After a simple lunch at the office the mayor observed our training courses and was especially impressed with the work produced by the embroidery students. This was followed by a visit to the new Tree Top Adventure Farm in Sylhet, with our trainees. The Adventure Farm is a family run outdoor activity centre, the first of its kind in Sylhet. There, despite the rain, the young people and the mayor enjoyed a tree top obstacle course including a zipline, tightropes, swinging logs and wobbly bridges. Although this adventure farm is very close to the city of Sylhet none of the young people had ever been there before.

During the visit the mayor said "I visited... 6 years ago and the project has improved massively. The school was under the sky before and now they have made a room which has a ceiling fan. The school service will be running regardless of the weather. The teachers here are doing a fantastic job."

Introducing Mohammed Hussain – Chairman of one of our new Centre Management Committees

Mohammed Hussain is the recently elected chairman of one of the Centre Management Committees. These have been formed during the past year as a means of helping to keep the work of the project going if there are no longer enough funds being sent from the UK. Each centre has a committee. They are collecting local funds and most have already opened a bank account. Committee members visit the schools, and some have helped to provide items of equipment. One committee organised and funded a magic show for the children attending the school. One organised food distribution for families in the area served by the school.

Mohammed is 48 years old and was born on the tea estate. His mother and father worked on the tea garden. He remembers that in his childhood there were shortages of food and sometimes there was no work on the tea gardens. He has 6 sisters and 2 brothers, but Mohammed is the only one amongst them who is still living and working on the tea garden. The others live in Sylhet city or the neighbouring district town of Moulvibazar. One brother lives in Saudi Arabia.

During Mohammed's childhood there was no school in the area and he attended one of the Schools Under the Sky based on Malnicherra Tea Garden. He remembers Peter East and Harun because they used to visit the school. The teachers name at the time was Aktar. Mohammed was one of the first children from the area to attend the Khasdobir Primary School.

For three years Mohammed has been a labour leader on the tea garden, looking after 265 workers.. As chair of the Centre Committee, he visits regularly and organises the meetings with the other seven members who are all guardians of children who attend. For a long time he had dreamed that there would be a preprimary centre in the area and he hopes that in future it will be possible to organise sewing classes and coaching from the centre for people living locally.

Dental camp treats 350 children from the Project

On the 18th December 6 dentists from the UK were due to arrive in Sylhet to provide dental examinations and treatment to the children at our centres. Unfortunately due to problems with their plane they could not depart on the scheduled date so arrived 2 days later. Despite this, with the help of dentists based in Sylhet, they saw 350 children with dental problems during their 4 day stay.



The team of dentists were all part of Dental Aid Network. They aim to promote oral health for the impoverished around the world that cannot access dental care. They achieve this through oral health education and by providing simple restorative and emergency dental treatment. Thanks to the dentists for helping children at the Khasdobir Project.



A new sewing group at our Hilwachara Centre

In July 2023 Shima Bauri (pictured below), who lives near the Hilwachara Centre, established a new sewing group for women. It meets on five evenings a week from 5pm to 6.30pm, after school, and when work in the tea gardens has finished. About 30 women attend. They are making items such as shalwar and children's clothes. At present they are sewing by hand but in future hope to use the sewing machines at the centre.

Shima was born in Sreemangal, a different district of Sylhet. She moved to Hilwachara in 2018, after her marriage. In Sreemangal she completed her higher secondary education in humanities. Recently Shima started attending the sewing class at the Project Office. She attended for 3 months and learnt a lot but could not continue because the fare for travel to the office was too high. Instead, she decided to form a group where women and girls could meet and learn to sew together on the Hilwachara tea estate. Shima says the women who come have learnt a lot and are already making clothes for their families. This makes a big contribution to the well-being of families because tea workers are amongst the lowest paid workers in Bangladesh.

One of the older women attending the class, who also moved to Hilwachara after her marriage, has one child. She is a housewife. It is the first time she has learnt sewing and she says the course is going well. Currently she is making a kameez, which is almost complete. Eventually she hopes to make clothes and sell them to other families so that she can avoid working on the tea estate.

Rafi currently attends the Lakatuura High School where her favourite subject is English. She is aged eleven. She has a brother who also attends school. In future Rafi hopes to earn money by making and selling clothes. To date she has made clothes for a small child.

Boishaki is 15 years old. She was born in Hilwachara and left school one year ago. Currently she is not working. She does not want to work on the tea estate. Both her older sisters work there, but Boishaki does not want to join them. If possible, she wants to earn money by making and selling clothes instead. She has already made clothes for her sisters.
